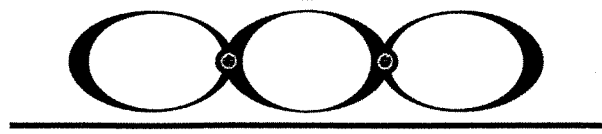

Patient Rights

As a patient of AlliedOP, you have the following rights under state law and regulations:

- To receive the care and health related services that are required by law.
- To receive an understandable explanation from you physician or his/her designee of your medical condition, recommended treatment, expected results, risks involved and reasonable alternatives.
- To give informed written consent prior to the start of treatment.
- To refuse treatment after possible consequences of this decision have been clearly explained.
- To be informed of the names and functions of health care professionals providing you care.
- To have prompt access to the information in your medical record. If your physician feels that this access is detrimental to your health, your next of kin or guardian has the right to see your record.
- To obtain a copy of your medical record, for a reasonable fee, within 30 days of a written request.
- To be treated with courtesy, consideration, and respect for your dignity and individuality.
- To be comfortable in your surroundings and have all reasonable requests attended to.
- To have physical privacy during treatments and testing, unless you need assistance.
- To exercise all your constitutional, civil, and legal rights.
